More than 8 years of experience using Drupal as an enterprise CMS. I work across two main areas: backend architecture for Drupal (multisite setups, custom PHP modules, migrations, JSON:API/GraphQL) and decoupled frontend development with React, Next.js, and Gatsby, deployed on Vercel.

I've led technical architecture for multisite projects in banking, retail, international government bodies (ECLAC/UN), and cultural institutions. I also run cloud infrastructure on Acquia and Pantheon with full CI/CD automation.

I'm also applying AI-assisted development — coding agents and prompt engineering — to speed up delivery and improve code quality without compromising architecture standards.

Designed and implemented the institution's first complete headless architecture: Drupal 9 as the backend CMS exposing content via GraphQL, consumed by GatsbyJS as a static frontend.

Built a PWA with offline capabilities designed for physical interactive kiosks located in the museum's exhibition galleries, allowing visitors to explore the archaeological catalog without an active internet connection.

Executed data migration and standardization from the museum's structured legacy resources into the new Drupal content model, ensuring catalog integrity and consistency.

Deployed the static frontend on Netlify with automated CI/CD from GitHub, and configured additional build pipelines for the institution's private servers.

Implemented Google Analytics to track visitor interaction with the application and optimize the in-gallery user experience.
